*Cancer Research* this month salutes the recipients in 1978 and 1979 of the Bristol-Myers Awards for Distinguished Achievement in Cancer Research, which include cash prizes of \$25,000.

For 1978, the award was won by Elizabeth Cavert Miller, Ph.D., and her husband, James A. Miller, Ph.D., of the University of Wisconsin, Madison, for their pioneering, long-term work on the metabolism and action of chemical carcinogens (see *Cancer Res.*, 38: 1479-1496, 1978). The Millers are pictured on the *upper left*.

For 1979, the award was presented to Gertrude Henle, M.D., and her husband, Werner Henle, M.D., of the Children's Hospital and the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, for research on the relationship of the Epstein-Barr virus to Burkitt's lymphoma, nasopharyngeal carcinoma, and infectious mononucleosis (see *Prog. Exp. Tumor Res.*, 21: 19-48, 1978). The Henles are pictured on the *lower left*.

Special Bristol-Myers citations were extended at the Awards ceremonies. In 1978, the citation was given to Mrs. Mary Lasker, of New York City, for her leadership and support of cancer activities. In 1979, the citation was given to Mr. Benno C. Schmidt, of New York City, for his work as chairman of the President's Cancer Panel. Mrs. Lasker and Mr. Schmidt are pictured in the two *circles* on the right.
