Errata

The article "Discordant Maturation as the Primary Biological Defect in Chronic Myelogenous Leukemia" by A. p. 6511, left column, Introduction, 1st paragraph, line 8: insert → after DXR.

p. 6511, left column, Introduction, 2nd paragraph, line 3: delete comma after "treatment" and insert period.

p. 6511, right column, 1st paragraph, line 6: F-1,6-F₂ should read F-1,6-P₂.

p. 6512, left column, 3rd paragraph, line 11: " $P < 0.01$ " should read " $P < 0.001$ ".

p. 6513, Table 2, 8th column (Catalase): lines 11–20 are incorrect; the correct values are 4.91, (2.97), 7.71, (3.63), 8.60, (3.43), 6.85, (1.56), 7.97, (2.11).

p. 6514, Table 3: Footnote *e* should be deleted and Footnote *f* changed to Footnote *e*; in the 7th column, line 11 should read 39.8^d; in the same column, line 19 should read 2.8^d.

p. 6514, left column, 2nd paragraph, line 15: "of" should read "to".
