


CANCER RESEARCH HAS A NEW ADDRESS

COVER LEGEND



Cancer Research congratulates George W. Santos on the receipt of the 11th annual Bristol-Myers award for distinguished achievement in cancer research. The award, conferred at a luncheon in New York on May

4, recognized his many contributions to bone marrow transplantation in human disease. Stemming from his longtime interest in the basic immunology of graft-versus-host disease following bone marrow transplantation, he developed broad principles for the use of cytotoxic agents such as cyclophosphamide for immunosuppression and the antitumor agent busulfan in treatment of leukemias, thus avoiding the need for total body irradiation to destroy malignant tissue prior to injection of donor bone marrow. Currently Dr. Santos is attempting attacks on solid tumors by combining high dose chemotherapy with subsequent bone marrow transplants. The history of bone marrow transplantation may be found in his paper (*Clin. Haematol.*, 12: 611-639, 1983).

Dr. Santos received the B.S. and M.S. degrees in biology from Massachusetts Institute of Technology and the M.D. from Johns Hopkins in 1955. After 2 years as a naval officer at the Naval Radiological Defense Laboratory in San Francisco where his interest in bone marrow transplantation began, he joined the staff at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. He has received several other awards, is a member of many professional societies, including the International Society for Experimental Hematology of which he was president in 1981-1982, and was an associate editor of this journal, 1978-1981, as well as an editorial board member of many other books and journals. He is author or coauthor of over 260 papers and book chapters. We are indebted to Dr. Santos and Nancy Taussig of Bristol-Myers for information and the photograph.
