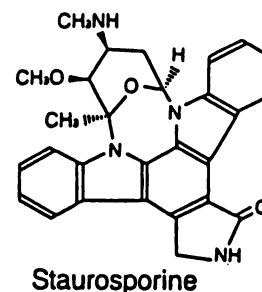
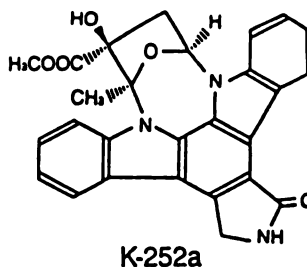

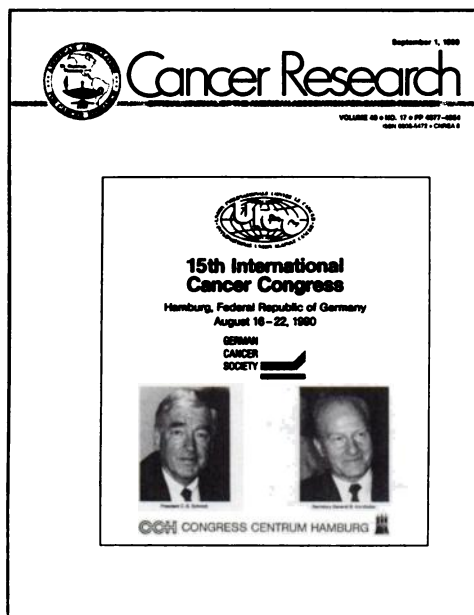
TOREMIFENE SYMPOSIUM

Jordan from the United States, and other notable oncologists from Finland.

The 15th International Cancer Congress sponsored by the International Union Against Cancer (UICC) will meet in Hamburg, Federal Republic of Germany, on August 16-22, 1990.

The Congresses, held every four years, provide a forum for the worldwide exchange of ideas, techniques, and results of clinical and research work. The Congress programs will be targeted for physicians, dentists, scientists, nurses, and allied health personnel, as well as for individuals involved in public education in oncology. Over 12,000 delegates from 95 nations are expected to attend.

The Congress will feature symposia, multidisciplinary panels, plenary lectures, proffered papers, poster sessions, postgraduate courses, round table discussions, commercial and scientific exhibits, and films. Detailed information will be provided to oncologists by circulars along with application forms for registration by September 1989.

The 1990 Congress will be held at Congress Centrum Hamburg (CCH) and the nearby University situated near Park Planten un Blumen, in the heart of the city of Hamburg.

The scientific program is being prepared through the joint efforts of the German National Program Committee and the UICC Scientific Advisory Board. As in the past, Edwin A. Mirand of Roswell Park Memorial Institute, 666 Elm Street, Buffalo, NY 14263 will be coordinating travel grant requests of Americans who plan to attend this meeting.

Pictured on the cover are the President of the Congress and the UICC, Carl G. Schmidt, from the West German Tumor Center in Essen; and the Secretary-General, Bernhard Kornhuber, of the German Cancer Society and University Hospital in Frankfurt.
